Activision Blizzard made \$1.2bn in three months from microtransactions

Activision Blizzard's recently quarterly financial report revealed some serious numbers for the July-September period, with microtransactions (or "in-game net bookings") increasing from \$709m to \$1.2bn.

- This is a 69% year-on-year improvement which, considering Activision Blizzard made a combined \$1.95bn across all revenues, means that microtransactions account for more than half of Activision Blizzard's total quarterly revenues.

Gabe Newell is sending a garden gnome into space

The move recalls Half-Life 2: Episode Two's famous Little Rocket Man achievement - which involved escorting a garden gnome (the playfully-named Gnome Chompski) through the entire game and tucking him into a rocket.

- While this may all sound like a joke, it's actually a charitable effort. Gnome Chompski will hitching a ride on a Rocket Lab satellite launch - and Gaben will donate \$1 for every person who watches the launch on stream. The money will go to the Starship children's hospital in Auckland, New Zealand.

The Medium refused classification in Australia

This rating typically means that the game will be banned from sale in Australia until all the offending issues are rectified - though what they are is anyone's guess. Developers Bloober Team have already confirmed that they are working to resolve the problems.

- The terminology is fairly dramatic but Refused Classification isn't the end of the line for many games. Australia's strict classification laws have come for a number of games in the past - and The Medium is an important upcoming Xbox console exclusive.

Demon's Souls remake will leverage PS5's new Activities feature

In a determined effort to be more accessible than the PS3 original, the upcoming Demon's Souls remake will include over 180 help videos via the new PS5 Activities feature - which Sony believe will "remove barriers to gameplay."

- The Activities functionality will allow players to access hints without leaving the game, and it looks like there will be quite a few hints for the Demon's Souls remake. Getting good will be easier than ever...which is an odd thought.

BlizzConline will be free for everyone

With the prospect of a physical BlizzCon show this year having gone out the window long ago, it'll now be a free, all-digital event running from February 19th-20th, 2021. J. Allen Brack called the event a "big virtual celebration."

- BlizzCon has typically been a pay-to-play event, with everything beyond the Opening Ceremony paywalled behind a \$40 Virtual Ticket - but this time it'll be completely free "to watch and engage in" BlizzConline
