





The 8 Essential Bar Chord Shapes


In this lesson we will learn the eight most essential bar chord shapes, based off of our open E and A chords. Below you will find chord diagrams representing the major, minor, dominant 7, and minor 7 barred shapes rooted on the E and A strings and common combinations of these shapes in different keys. Let's get started!

Open position E chords:













E rooted bar chord shapes (Key of A): (These bar chords are based off the open chords above)
























A rooted bar chord shapes (key of D): (These bar chords are based off the open chords above)




1) Major 1.4.5 Progression, key of A:
