DISNEY

The film is a parody of many Disney elements, which follows Jeffrey Katzengberg's bitter departure from Disney in 1994 to form Dreamworks. After all, Dreamworks first movie Antz was made just to get into cinemas before A Bugs Life [1], so much of early Dreamworks was motivated by spite, so it makes sense Shrek would be a dig at the animation juggernaut. It is speculated that Lord Fuckwad, err I mean, Lord Farquaad is based on former Disney CEO Michael Eisner, but this comparison to a vapid and self-centered [2] villain who captures and tortures fairytale creatures to grow his theme-park like empire, is unverified. But what about the Disney movies?

The film begins and ends with a story book being opened and closed, which is a direct reference to classic fairy-tale Disney movies, like Snow White and Cinderella. In fact, the pair of princesses crop up a few times, in Farquaad's dating simulator and at the end to catch the bouquet - this dwarf's name must be Horny because he is super into this.[1] Obviously these characters exist as fairy tales, but so much has been consumed by Disney that it's more likely to be known as a Disney property first and foremost.

For example, we briefly see the three good fairies from Sleeping Beauty, colour coded as they are from the movie. The latter of which became the music video, so if you wondered why Ben Stiller is in your meme-song, that's why. It was only put into Shrek's opening credits as a placeholder song to be replaced later, but it just felt right.

Smash Mouth were hesitant to allow Dreamworks to use the song, but after they were given an early screening, they not only agreed to the song being used, they agreed to perform a new cover song for the finale, "I'm A Believer".

So anyway, Smash Mouth cover it too and it has this Oi part. [1] But if you look at Smash Mouth's music video [2] - the Oi is gone and it's not on the soundtrack either. The only place the Oi appears in this song, is in the movie. But why is it here? This has bugged me for YEARS and it wasn't until researching this video did I find out why. In 1995, British comedians Vic Reeves and Bob Mortimer along with EMF cover the song and guess what. They Oi. [3] The Oi! stems from late 70s British punk music [4], so it's easy to see why Vic and Bob worked it in but how did it wind up in Shrek?! Well this is speculation but - they probably wanted a more up-beat version of the song than the Monkees, it's for the film's finale after all. So Smash Mouth was the best fit but like how All Star was a temp song, they would have needed a temp song for this scene until Smash Mouth finished their cover. So in comes Vic and Bob's version and they obviously became guite attached to it, because they redid the Oi, just to keep it in. Even Eddie Murphy's ending part is again not in Smash Mouth's version, but it is in Vic and Bob's version. It's crazy to me that the frying pan guys [5] are referenced in Shrek, and as far as I can see, totally uncredited. [6]

Robin Hood speaking French may have influence from English nobility in the middle ages spoke French after the Norman conquests, so Robin Hood, traditionally from noble heritage, would logically speak French too. But its unlikely that's why.

Shrek is full of accents, from Scottish Shrek, British Blind Mice, German Pigs so a French Robin Hood is mainly there to be a silly funny accent among others, playing with stereotypes, another tradition in comedy, but one that doesn't always age very well.

But lets look at it's main inspiration. Shrek! with the exclamation mark is the 1990 children's book by William Steig. [1] Shrek is a Yiddish word which itself is derived from the German word Schreck to me fear or frighten.

What is more present is the subversion to the normal fairytale which Shrek absolutely pulls off.

William Steig also wrote Sylvester And The Magic Pebble, a story about a donkey who finds a pebble who grants wishes and accidentally turns himself into a boulder, which may have inspired this line.
