Use lids to mix your washes. They are free and it's always nice to recycle stuff.



A sponge is ideal to apply texture or to create chipping.




Use make-up sponges to remove oil washes, since they don't leave any fibres behind.



A nice mix of flat and round brushes.

Starting from a black primed model, apply a base coat with VMC Black.

Thin pure Rubber Black 2:1 with water and apply a first layer with a sponge to create texture.

Mix 2:1 and apply again with a sponge. Try to focus more on the edges this time, leaving some of the previous layer shine through.

Mix 1:1 and apply a final Highlight, covering a smaller area than before, focusing on the edges.

I painted the rims with an airbrush and hairspray chipping as a first step, since it is easier to mask the rims with tape than the rubber parts. If you do the same, remove the masking tape now.



Mix the two oil paints 1:1 and add White Spirits to thin them down to a wash consistency. Apply all over the rubber and in selected spots on the rims



To get back some definition, use a make up sponge and White Spirits to remove some of the oil wash on the raised areas. The sponge should be moist, not soaking wet, or you might remove too much wash.



Let the paints dry over night. If you use your model for gaming, I would recommend giving it a few thin coats of matt varnish.
