WHY ARE RPG BOOKS SO HARD TO READ?

I've bought a shitload of different RPG systems for possible use with the Daddies, and I can now confidently say:

Most of them are fucking impenetrable.

Here's how your typical RPG rulebook is designed:

• 20 pages of "flavor" nobody reads

• 10 pages describing what an RPG is (aka, something we all know already)

• 20 pages describing what wisdom, strength, dexterity, and constitution are (or, even worse, the system uses synonyms for all these stats and then forces you to learn which ones correspond to the ones you already know)

• 10 pages describing a bunch of specific character creation details that you can't make heads or tails of because you don't know how the game is played yet

• 10 more pages of flavor nobody reads

• 5 pages of combat tutorial (actually useful)

5 pages of skill check tutorial (actually useful)
20 pages of how to DM that

basically boil down to the author being like, "I dunno, make up stuff your players like and be aggressive."

These books aren't written with human beings in mind. They're appendices on top of rules on top of glossaries for things you can't understand unless you spend hours referencing and crossreferencing chapters against other chapters.

Part of this is due to the fact that most systems, in my opinion, are just way too complex (*Shadowrun* has specific rules for swimming). Mostly, though, this is just a matter of organization and teaching.

If your system is complex enough to require a big, chonky book, I need to be able to get to the juicy part quickly. That means establishing the vibe of your system- how it's meant to feel, how it's meant to play, what makes it specialand then immediately leading into a character creation tutorial.

I do NOT need to understand every single little thing right off the bat in order to get into your game. I DO need to give a rat's ass about finding out the important stuff. And by "important stuff," I mean character creation and conflict resolution.

Like, videogames have this down pat. You load up the game; you get a cutscene explaining why you should give a shit about what's going on; you build your character (the first time you do this, you're just picking stuff that sounds cool- later on, you'll have a better idea of); you're tossed into a small pocket of combat or platforming or whateverthefuck that teaches you how things work in a lowstakes environment.

RPG books should do this. Like, straight up, singleplaverwhere chapters the ass author behaves as a DM and walks you through what it's like to experience a few minutes of the game from the perspective of the player. This would be useful to both players and Dungeon Masters alike, because you can't really know how to DM unless you know how the game is meant to feel as a player.

I'm going to stop myself before I rant any further. If this is something you're interested in reading more about, though -- specifically, my irritation with RPG system design and how they could be more user-friendly -- say so in the discord and I'll write more about it for the next *Daddy Issues.*

Dumb and Dumber is a movie about two friends. It is a heartwarming movie, but it is also sad because they are two good friends and the movie is calling them dumb.




Ultimately the movie never reveals which friend is "Dumb" and which friend is "Dumber." That's one of the mysteries of cinema. I love the sheepdog car.



CROSS TRANK


