
The Crashed Idiagon Scroll

Ruined Sobagons

- 1. [Herbalist Wagon] This bronze and copper framed wagon was once a traveling greenhouse used to collect and grow herbs from all across the realm. Now it lies in a mangled heap with blighted weeds growing up from piles of shattered glass.
- {Rancher's Wagon} Resembling a small
 white and blue barn, this wagon was home
 to a halfling family who traveled the
 hills with their goats and slept in cozy
 hammocks strung up in the hayloft.
- 3. {star Chaser Wagon} A 30-foot-tall observatory tower teeters atop this otherwise ordinary wagon, though the broken telescope hangs limply observing only the marshy ground below.



- 4. {Dead Man's Wagon} This rusty prisoner's wagon is little more than an iron cage on wheels, but etched into its bars are the tales of those it brought to the hangman.
- 5. {Defender's Tower} Built from stolid stone and set atop iron wheels, this wagon was more a mobile watchtower than a wagon once used by a selfless knight who would take it wherever vigilance was needed.
- 6. {Church Wagon} At one time this humbly crafted wagon, which resembles both a small church and inn dedicated to the god of travelers, was used to deliver roadside sermons and prayers to wayward souls.
- 7. {Nested Wagon} Covered in nests of various sorts, this wagon was either once home to an avid bird watcher or has been claimed by birds in the previous owner's absence.
- 8. {Cave Wagon} Far from a true cave on wheels, this crudely built wagon resembles a cave-like burrow made of scavenged {and stollen} wood planks and was used to transport goblin nobility.

- 1. {Portrait} Hanging crooked is a painting of the family who called this wagon home.
- 2. [Moon Saber] Though a bit rusty, an heirloom saber with moon-iconography is tucked under the wagon's bench.
- 3. {Letter} Tucked between the seats is a love letter that never reached its recipient.



- 4. {Suit} A fanciful suit commissioned, perhaps, for an upcoming ball or gala.
- 5. {Decorative Horns} Mounted atop the wagon is a pair of gold-etched gazelle horns.
- {Map} A blood stained map that leads to an off-road destination which would be inaccessible for the wagon.
- {Dress Collection} Stored in a waterproof compartment are 3 breathtaking dresses intended as gifts for a princess.
- 8. [Silver Arrows] Peppering the wagon are 1d10 silver-tipped arrows whose razorsharp heads resemble snarling bears.
- Poison Hidden under the driver's seat is a case designed to securely store 2 vials of poison, only one of which is still present and unopened.
- 10 (Flower Collection) A portable drawer containing sheets of beautiful pressed flowers from exotic lands.
