

BLOOD BOWL CHAOS ALL STARS

FOUNDATION TUTORIAL



INTRODUCTION

Hi, this is Rich. Today I'll be showing you how I re-created the classic 'Eavy Metal pink and green colour scheme for the Chaos All Stars Blood Bowl Team using one of the plastic Chaos Blockers.

Clean and assemble the miniature and attach it to a suitable painting handle (in this case some jewellery wire and an old champagne cork) then prime the entire miniature using **Chaos Black Spray Primer**.

Now I'll show you how to paint the three dominant elements for this scheme.

PAINTS:

CITADEL Death Guard Green Fulgrim Pink Emperor's Children Lahmian Medium VALLEJO GAME COLOUR Heavy Warmgrey 72.148 Goblin Green 72.030 Verdigris 72.096 VALLEJO MODEL COLOUR Park Green Flat 70.969 Dark Kraken SIN-45

PAINT STEP BY STEP WITH THE ARTIST!

Wherever you see this button this tutorial has an accompanying audio commentary from the artist.

ALSO USED:

Citadel Chaos Black Primer

Vallejo Mecha Matte Varnish

TOOLS:



I only used a small selection of my typical brush sizes for this - I prefer Kolinsky sable.



I used airbrush for some of the early basecoats but it isn't essential though!

GREEN ARMOUR

STEP 1

As we're re-creating the classic 'Eavy Metal pink and green colour scheme we'll start with the green armour.

Using an airbrush, basecoat the armour with a mix of **Goblin Green** 4:1 **Park Green Flat**.

Thin your paint and apply as many coats as required for a solid finish, three coats were needed here.

This green basecoat can also act as a nice basecoat for the rest of colours we'll be using so don't worry about being to precise with the airbrush.



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GREEN ARMOUR

STEP 2

Shade the armour with a wash mix of **Dark Kraken** 1:6 **Lahmian Medium**.

Apply the wash thinly. Wait for the first coat to dry and then go back and apply a second coat into the recesses.



STEP 3

Start to highlight the green armour by reapplying the mix of Goblin Green 4:1

Park Green Flat.

Apply a couple of coats to get a solid highlight, making sure to leave room to add further highlights on top. Tidy up any mistakes as you go along.

Apply the highlights to the raised areas that you feel would naturally catch the light from your light source.



GREEN ARMOUR

STEP 4

Continue to highlight the armour with a mix of Goblin Green, Park Green Flat and Green Sky in a 4:1:3 ratio mix.



STEP 5

Add final highlights to the armour with **Green Sky**.



PINK CLOTH

STEP 6

Start with a basecoat of **Emperor's Children**.

Thin your paint on your wet palette to make it easier to apply. Emperor's Children has poor coverage so you will probably need three to four thin coats to get a solid basecoat.



STEP 8

Start to highlight the pink areas by re-applying **Emperor's Children**.





STEP 7

Shade the pink areas with a wash of **Red Shade**.

Use the wash straight from the bottle but don't water this down as adding water to these Vallejo washes can negatively affect the finish.

Don't be over generous with this application but make sure all the recesses are shaded.



STEP 9

Add final highlights with **Fulgrim Pink**.

GREEN SKIN

The last distinctive element of the original 'Eavy Metal scheme is the pale green skin.

STEP 10

Start the skin with a basecoat mix of **Deathguard Green** 1:1 **Heavy Warmgrey**.



STEP 11

Apply a wash of

Green Shade to all of
the skin. Shade all the
recesses but don't be
over generous.

Use the wash neat but don't add water to thin as this will have a negative effect the finish of Vallejo washes.





STEP 12

Re-apply the mix of

Deathguard Green

1:1 Heavy Warmgrey

to the skin as the first
highlight.



STEP 13

Continue to highlight the skin with a mix of **Deathguard Green**, **Heavy Warmgrey** and **Verdigris** in a 1:1:1 ratio mix.



STEP 14

Add final highlights
to the skin with
Verdigris applying to
just the uppermost
areas that would
catch the light.



I hope this has inspired you to re-create this colour scheme on your own Blood Bowl Chaos miniatures.

A whole team painted in this scheme would look wonderful on the tabletop!
