



# RED NECRON ARMOUR

FOUNDATION TUTORIAL

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# INTRODUCTION

Hi, this is Rich. Today I will be showing you a simple and straight forward Black and Red armour colour scheme for your Necron miniatures.

First, clean and assemble the miniature, attach it to a suitable painting handle and prime with **Colour Forge Matt Black Primer** before we start painting.

## PAINTS:

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### CITADEL

- *Celestra Grey*
- *Nuln Oil*

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### P3

- *Khador Red Base*

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### VALLEJO MODEL COLOUR

- *Black 70.950*

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## ALSO USED:

**Colour Forge Matt Black Primer**

## TOOLS:



I only used a small selection of my typical brush sizes for this - I prefer Kolinsky sable.



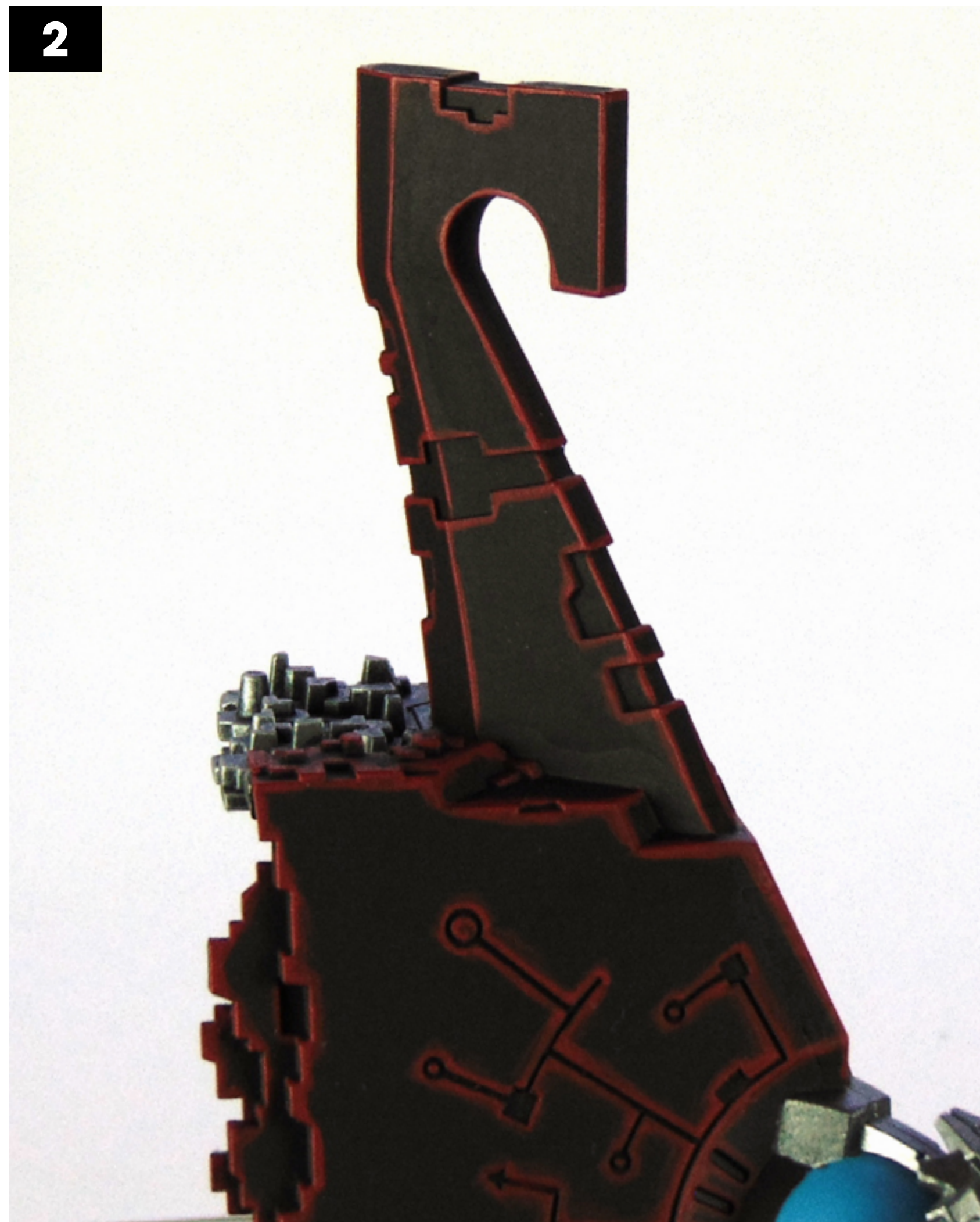
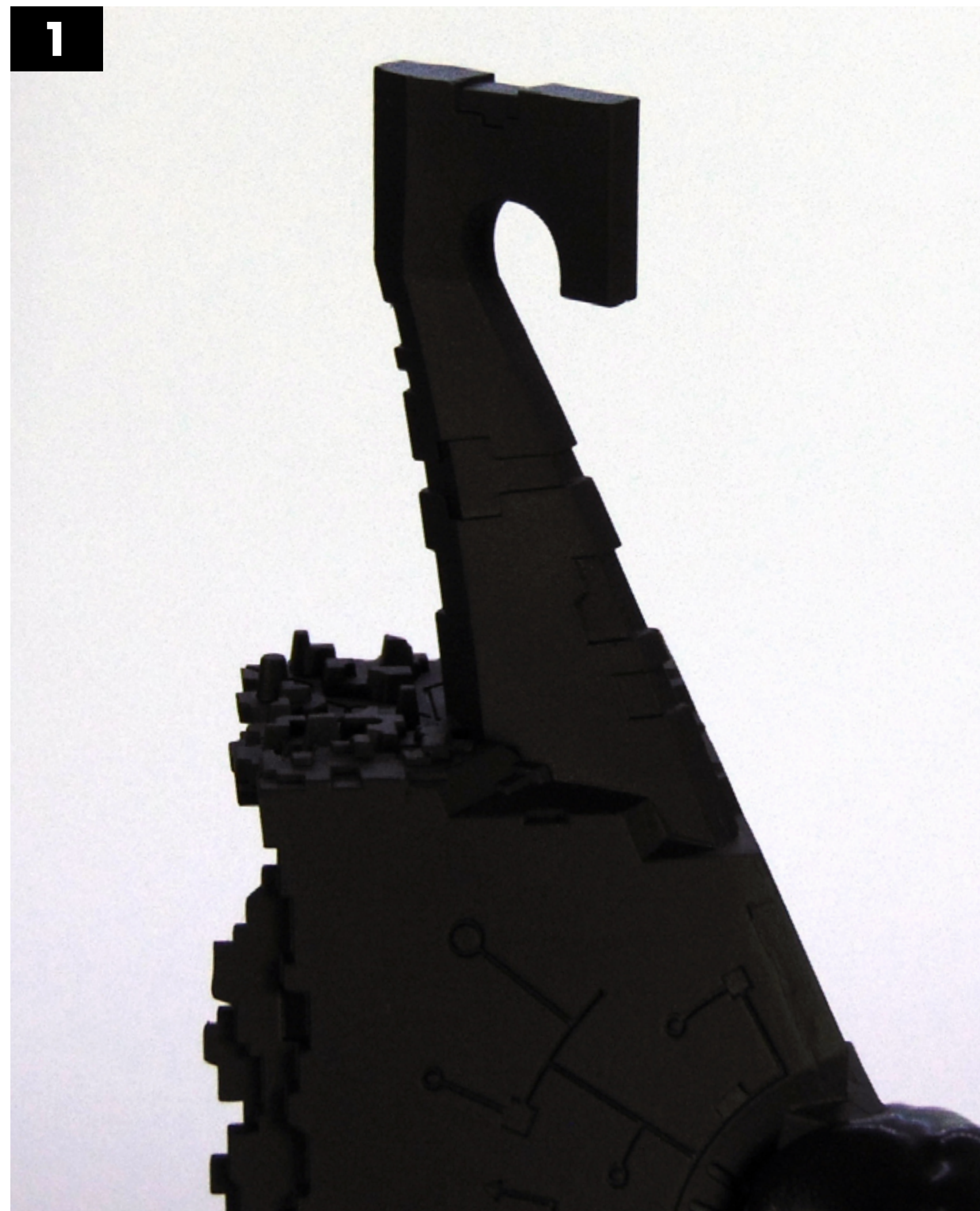
An airbrush was used for applying some of the basecoats but this was just for speed, you could just as easily use a brush.



### PAINT STEP BY STEP WITH THE ARTIST!

Wherever you see this button this tutorial has an accompanying audio commentary from the artist.

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## STEP 1

With an airbrush apply a basecoat mix of **Black 5:1 Mephiston Red** over the whole miniature.

Thin your paint and apply as many coats as required for a even finish.

## STEP 2

Highlight the edges of the armour with **Mephiston Red** using a **Size #00 Brush** and highlight all the edges in the same way, leaving room to add a further highlight on top of this one.

Take your time to make sure you get good, strong highlights.

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## STEP 3

Apply a wash of **Nuln Oil** straight from the pot over the armour to shade the recesses as well as glazing the surface.

Don't apply too much so that it doesn't pool in the recesses and leave to dry completely before moving on.

## STEP 4

Add edge highlights to the armour with **Khador Red Base** and using a **Size #00 Brush**, apply the highlights only to the uppermost raised areas that would naturally catch the light.
