MYLRA TRIVIA:

The skies on Mylora have a slightly greenish in tint.

Mylora adopted a global language about 700 years prior to the start of the story. There is only one spoken language now, but still different dialects spoken in different cultures across the planet. The dialects are similar enough there are essentially no language barriers.

Mylora no moons of its own; its sky is dominated by the gas giant it orbits.

Mylora's star is a main sequence yellow dwarf star, but Mylora orbits a gas giant.

MYLORIANT SPECIES: Myloriens are the sole dominant species on Mylora

PHYSICAL TRAITS:

Myloriens have a range of skin tones and phenotypes depending on the continent or region they are from.

All Myloriens have similar eye structures with chromataphors in the iris. These chromataphores will expand and contract based on emotional responses and body temperature, causing the visible colour of the eye to change.

They have elongated ears with three points and a long frill that runs along the lower edge. The colour of the frill is based on the region from which one descends; there are a wide range of frill colours.

Most Myloriens wear their hair long except certain religious groups.

□FESPAN
Their average natural life span is around 500 UA standard years.

SPECIES TRIVIA:

The colour-range present in a Myorien's occular chromatophores varies based on genetic heritage. There are 4 predominant sub-groups.

Myloriens have two hearts. They also have redundancies in some other organs.

Short hair is uncommon on Mylora and touching a non-family member's hair is considered an act of considerable intimacy in most Mylorien cultures. They consider kissing less intimate than hair touching.

About 2/3 of Myloriens are born with some form of empathic ability. Empaths are well-regarded in Mylorien society.

Myloriens age at a notably slower pace than many other species, reaching maturity much later (around 30 is considered 'adult') and staying in their prime much longer.

Myloriens have no problem intermarrying with other species.

Myloriens are a generally dimorphic mammalian species with two broad mating types.

They are capable of interbreeding with multiple other races, but couples may have slight trouble conceiving depending on the species of the other parent.

Gender has not been important in Mylorien culture for centuries and, as such, Mylorien society does not have a concept of "gender roles." Most (but not all) Myloriens do not strongly identify with a specific gender.

This does not mean every Mylorien is nonbinary or gender neutral but that their attachment to the idea of any gender - binary or not - is on the weaker side. Outside of their own culture, many simply adopt whatever identifying language is most convenient for the people around them.
